The Feud Between Popes and Emperors

Many historians and theologians believe that roots of the desperate power struggles between popes and emperors during the Middle Ages and through the Renaissance period can be traced to Charlemagne and Pope Leo III.

Remember that Pope Leo III had sought political aid from Charlemagne and his army against rebellious nobles in Rome in 799 AD. Because of Charlemagne's help against Pope Leo's opponents, he was crowned by the pope as "Emperor of the Romans." What appears at first glance to be a simple gesture of gratitude, will later haunt the Church and kings of the age. Who has more power: popes or kings?

The feud between King Henry IV and Pope Gregory VII is no exception; it perfectly showcases the ongoing debate of power between these two respected positions in Medieval society.
